GNAC WOMEN'S GOLF ALL-TIME PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

2010-11

Week of Sept. 6-12: Kalli Stanhope, MSU Billings (Jr., Glendive, MT - Dawson County) won the MSU Yellowjacket Invitational with a 36-hole total of 155 at the Briarwood Golf Club in Billings. She finished three shots ahead of the field in leading the Yellowjackets to a 19-stroke victory over second-place Rocky Mountain on the par-72 6,310 yard layout.

Week of Sept. 17-23: Katie Sharpe, Western Washington (Sr., Bellingham, WA - Santa Clara) finished fifth in the Sonoma State Invitational with a 54-hole score of 223 on rounds of 73, 76 and 74 to lead the Vikings to a second-place team finish.

Week of Sept. 24-30: Sophie Elstrott, Western Washington (Jr., Eugene, OR - South Eugene) finished second in the Grand Canyon Invitational with a 36-hole score of one-under par 143. She led the Vikings to a share of the team title with Western New Mexico. Both schools had 36-hole totals of 591. Elstrott was one of two players to birdie the 18th hole in Tuesday's final round to earn WWU a share of the title. Elstrott is averaging a team-best 73.4 strokes per round for the nationally 18th-ranked Vikings.

Week of Oct. 4-10: Kalli Stanhope, MSU Billings (Jr., Glendive, MT - Dawson County) finished third in the Nebraska Kearney Invitational with a 36-hole score of 153, including a 74 on Tuesday when MSUB shot a team score of 316, the second lowest in school history. She had a 79 and was one of only four players to break 80 on Monday as high winds sent the scores soaring.

Week of Oct. 11-17: Sophie Elstrott, Western Washington (Jr., Eugene, OR - South Eugene) and Katie Sharpe, Western Washington (Sr., Bellingham, WA - Santa Clara) each carded identical 36-hole totals of 147 in sharing medallist honors at the Western Washington Invitational at the Bellingham Golf and Country. Elstrott had rounds of 72 and 75, while Sharpe shot rounds of 73 and 74 on the par-73, 6,209 yard layout. The two led the Vikings to a 12-stroke team victory. On the season, Elstrott leads the GNAC in scoring with a 74.0 average. Sharpe is averaging 75.8.

Week of Mar. 14-20: Kalli Stanhope, MSU Billings (Jr., Glendive, MT) won medallist honors in the MSU Billings Yellowjacket Invitational at Eaglerock Golf Course in Billings Thursday and Friday. Stanhope carded rounds of 74 and 75 and finished two shots ahead of Rachel Hosterman of Rocky Mountain. The win was Stanhope's second during the 2010-11 season. She has finished in the Top 5 in four of MSUB's five tournaments.

Week of Mar. 21-27: Melissa Saken, MSUB (Fr., Peers, Alberta - Parkland) won medallist honors in the Colorado State Pueblo Invitational with a 36-hole score of 157. Saken was the only golfer to break 80 in the first round when she shot a 78. She then added a 79 in the second round to win the tournament by two shots. Prior to the tournament, she had shot in the 70s in only two of her previous 10 rounds.

Week of Apr. 4-10: Claire Rachor, Western Washington (So., Bellingham) fired a tourney-best 1-under par 71 and had a 36-hole total of 147 in finishing second at the Grand Canyon Spring Invitational Women's Golf Tournament at the Palm Valley Golf Club in Goodyear, Ariz. Rachor, who ranks just fifth on her team and sixth in the GNAC in scoring averaging 79.4 (among players participating in 2/3 of their team's rounds), tied with Grand Canyon's Ashley Mooney for medalist honors at 147, but Mooney won the one-hole playoff with a birdie. Rachor's 71, which included three birdies and two bogeys, tied her for the GNAC's best round of the season.

2011-12

Week of Sept. 12-18: Karly Olsen, Saint Martin's (Sr., Bellingham, WA - Sehome) carded a two-over par 74 in the second round and finished ninth overall with a 36-hole score of 156 to lead the Saints to a third-place finish in the Colorado Christian Fall Invitational. Olsen's round was the second best in the tournament and the best in the second round as she helped the Saints post a team score of 304 (the second best in the tournament) after shooting 331 in the first round.

Week of Sept. 26-Oct. 2: Kalli Stanhope, Montana State Billings (Sr., Glendive, MT - Dawson County) won the Rocky Mountain Invitational Monday, finishing the 54-hole tournament with a score of 219. Her second-round 70 on the Par 71, 5,989 yard Peter Yegen Golf Club layout in Billings was the lowest in the brief two-year history of women's golf in the GNAC, breaking the record of 71 set last season by Sophie Elstrott of Western Washington. Elstrott shot 71 on four different occasions last season.

Week of Oct. 3-9: Sophie Elstrott, Western Washington (Sr., Eugene, OR - South Eugene), who won three tournaments last season, won the Saint Martin's Invitational with a 36-hole score of 148 to lead the Vikings into the team title. Both Elstrott and the Vikings were the defending champions.

Week of Oct. 10-16: Alex Taylor, Western Washington, shot a 75 Tuesday, equaling the fifth lowest round of the day to lead the Vikings to a tie for the team title in the 18th annual Western Washington Invitational at the Bellingham Golf and Country Club. Taylor ended up tied for eighth in the tournament with teammate Sophie Elstrott with a 36-hole score of 152.

Week of Oct. 24-30: Claire Rachor, Western Washington (Jr., Bellingham) tied for medalist honors in the Sonoma State Invitational leading the Vikings to their third straight tournament title. Rachor had rounds of 73 and 75 to tie Kylie Barros of UBC who had rounds of 74 and 74. Rachor finished the fall season with a 76.9 scoring average, which currently ranks second in the GNAC trailing only teammate Sophie Elstrott, who has a 75.8 average. Elstrott finished third at the Sonoma meet with a 151 total. WWU opened up a 17-stroke first round lead and finished 11 shots ahead of runner-up UBC.

Week of Oct. 31-Nov. 6: Kim Vivian, Saint Martin's (Jr., Lacey, WA - Timberline) shot rounds of 76, 70 and 77 and finished eighth in the Hawaii Hilo Dennis Rose Invitational with a 54-hole score of 223. Her 70 was the best in the second round and she was the only Saint player to break 80 in either the second or third round. SMU finished seventh with a 54-hole team score of 948.

Week of Mar. 12-18: Kalli Stanhope, MSU Billings (Sr., Glendale, MT - Dawson County) had a 36-hole total of five-over-par 151 to successfully her title in the MSUB Spring Invitational at Pryor Creek Golf Club in Billings. Stanhope finished six shots ahead of the field in winning her second tournament of the season and her fourth over the past two seasons. Stanhope currently ranks second in the conference in scoring averaging 76.9 strokes for nine rounds.

Week of Mar. 19-25: Kalli Stanhope, MSU Billings (Sr., Glendale, MT - Dawson County) had rounds of 72 and 77 to win the Colorado State Pueblo Thunderwolf Spring Invitational with a 36-hole score of 149. Her 72 equalled the fourth lowest round of the season in the GNAC. She now has three of the five lowest rounds in the conference this season and is the season conference scoring leader with a 76.5 average. The win was her third of the season and her fifth in the past two seasons. It was her first win on a course located outside of Billings.

Week of Apr. 2-8: Alex Taylor, Western Washington (Sr., Sammamish, WA - Eastlake) was the top GNAC finisher in the Grand Canyon Invitational at Litchfield Park, Ariz., placing 19th with a 36-hole score of 157. After shooting a 82 on Monday, she carded a season-equaling best four-over par 75 on Tuesday. On the year, Taylor ranks third on the team and fourth in the GNAC in scoring averaging 79.4 per round.

Week of Apr. 9-15: Claire Rachor, Western Washington (Jr., Bellingham, WA) finished eighth in the Doc Housewright Invitational in Granbury, Tex. Rachor had rounds of 73 and 76 in the tournament, which featured three of the Top 12 ranked teams in the country. Rachor lowered her season average to 77.4 with her 149 total. That ranks second this year in the conference.

2012-13

Week of Sept. 16-23: Kristen Hansen, Western Washington (Fr., Spokane, WA – Mead) carded a final round score of one-under-par 71 (the third best round of the tournament) to finish in a tie for 13th at 152 and lead the Vikings to a seventh place team finish in the Angelo State Concho River Classic at San Angelo, Tex. Hansen's eight-over par score earned her Red Lion Player of the Week accolades.

Week of Sept. 24-30: Anna Bourland (5-3, So., Bainbridge, WA) tied with teammate Kristen Hansen (Fr., Spokane, WA – Mead) for 10th place in the Grand Canyon Fall Invitational. Both players had 36-hole totals of 151. Bourland opened with a 76, then carded a 75. Hansen had a 78 on Monday and a 73 on Tuesday. Western Washington finished eighth in the tournament with a 36-hole team score of 622. Host Grand Canyon won the tournament with a 603 total.

Week of Oct. 1-7: Kara Zitzman, Western Washington (Sr., Woodinville, WA – Redmond) had the highest finish by a GNAC golfer placing seventh in the Saint Martin's Invitational with a 36-hole score of 161. Zitzman led the Vikings to a third-place team finish, just three shots back of second-place UBC and claimed the *Red Lion Golfer of the Week* award.

Week of Oct. 8-14: Anna Bourland, Western Washington (So., Bainbridge, WA) was the only GNAC golfer to finish in the Top 15 Monday and Tuesday in the Western Washington Invitational at the Bellingham Golf and Country Club earning her GNAC Red Lion Golfer of the Week honors for Oct. 8-14. Bourland had a second-round score of 71 – the best round of the tournament – to finish tied for eighth with a 153 total as she led the Vikings to a seventh-place finish.

Week of Oct. 22-28: Nicky Jordan, Simon Fraser (Jr., Sidney, BC) finished seventh in the Victoria Shootout with a 36-hole score of 159. After opening with an 83, the *GNAC Red Lion Women's Golfer of the Week* carded a four-over par 76 at the Cordova Bay Golf Club to lead the Clan to a fourth-place team finish.

Week of Oct. 29-Nov. 4: Sarah Salvatori, Saint Martin's (Fr., Salem, OR - Sprague) finished in a tie for ninth in the Hawaii Hilo Dennis Rose Invitational with a 54-hole score of 237. Salvatori had rounds of 80, 77 and 80 in leading the Saints to a fourth-place team finish and claiming the *GNAC Red Lion Golfer of the Week* award.

Week of Feb. 25-Mar. 3: Anna Bourland, Western Washington (So., Bainbridge, WA) finished 13th out of 60 golfers to lead the Vikings to a seventh place team finish in the Cal State East Bay Pioneer Shootout. Bourland finished with a 36-hole total of 164, shooting rounds of 80 and 84.

Week of Mar. 11-17: Katie Fish, MSU Billings (So., Great Falls, MT) shot a pair of six-over par rounds of 79 to finish third with a 36-hole total of 158 and lead the Yellowjackets to a team title in the MSUB Yellowjacket Spring Invitational. Fish ranks fourth in the GNAC in scoring this season with a 81.6 average.

Week of Apr. 8-14: Clair Rachor, Western Washington (Sr., Bellingham) finished sixth with a 153 total in the Tarleton State Don Housewright Invitational to lead the Vikings to a fifth-place team finish. Rachor, who won the award for the second week in a row, had rounds of 78 and 75 as she grabbed the season scoring lead in the GNAC with an average of 80.5.

Week of Apr. 15-21: Claire Rachor, Western Washington (Sr., Bellingham) finished sixth with a 153 total in the Tarleton State Don Housewright Invitational to lead the Vikings to a fifth place team finish, Rachor had rounds of 78 and 75 as she grabbed the season scoring lead in the GNAC with an average of 80.5.

2013-14

Week of Sept. 9-15: Katie Fish, MSUB (Jr., Great Falls, MT – Charles M. Russell) grabbed a second place finish at the Yellowjackets' annual fall invitational, thanks to a stellar second round of 73 after shooting a 79 in round one. Not only was her 152 total the third best mark in program history and her 73 round fifth best, but she helped the team to a school-record low round of 298 and a first place finish in the tournament.

Week of Sept. 23-30: Kristen Hansen (So., Spokane, WA – Mead) of WWU came up one stroke shy of a share for first place in the Western New Mexico Invitational on Tuesday. Hansen notched a 2-under par 70 on Monday and followed with a 78 on Tuesday for a 148 total. Her two-round total helped the Vikings to a 617 overall and a fourth place finish in the 18-team tournament.

Week of Oct. 1-6: Samantha Miller, NNU (Fr., Hillsboro, OR – Hillsboro) shot a two-round total of 152 (74-78), in her first-ever collegiate event at the Saint Martin's Invitational. Her first round score of 74 contributed to the Crusaders' school-record single round of 329, and NNU finished seventh overall in the tournament.

Week of Oct. 7-13: Jennifer Liedes, SMU (So., Olympia, WA – Olympia) fired a Saint Martin's school-record single round total of 71 en route to a third-place finish at the WWU Invitational. Liedes was the highest-finishing GNAC individual, while helping the Saints to a fourth-place finish as a team in the tournament.

Week of Oct. 14-20: Haley Gochnour, NNU (So., Boise, ID – Cole Valley Christian) tied for 10th with a 159 total, leading the Crusaders to a third-place finish, highlighted by a school record-round of 323, in the University of Victoria Shootout.

Week of Oct. 21-27: Kristen Hansen, Western Washington (So., Spokane, WA – Mead) tied for third place with a 36-hole score of 150 to lead the Vikings to a fourth-place finish in the Sonoma State Women's Golf Fall Invitational at the Santa Rosa Golf and Country Club. It was the fourth Top 10 finish in four outings for Hansen, who finished three shots behind the leader. She finished the fall season leading the GNAC in scoring with a 76.1 scoring average.

Week of March 3-9: Samantha Miller (Northwest Nazarene) was the individual medalist Friday in a dual match against The College of Idaho, shooting a 5-over 77 at Ridgecrest Golf Club. Miller won by five strokes and led the Crusaders to their first team win over the Coyotes, 332-338, in the program's history.

Week of March 31 – April 6: Melissa Saken, Montana State Billings (Sr., Peers, AB – Parkland Composite) tied for 11th place at the Western New Mexico Invitational last week, shooting a two-round total of 153 (79-74). Her 74 in Round 2 was the lowest by a GNAC golfer at the tournament, and it was her lowest of the 2013-14 season.

Week of April 14-20: Kristen Hansen, Western Washington (So., Spokane, WA - Mead) finished tied for seventh at the shortened Tarleton State Doc Housewright Invitational, shooting a 1-over par 73 in the lone round of the tournament. Hansen was the top GNAC finisher at the event, helping Western Washington to a fourth place finish among the 9-team field. The Vikings totaled a score of 304.

GNAC WOMEN'S GOLF ALL-TIME PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

2014-15

Week of Sept. 22-28: Jenn Paul, Western Washington, finished tied for fifth at the Western New Mexico Fall Intercollegiate, collecting a two-round score of 148. She opened with a first round score of 71 and finished with a 75. She was the only GNAC golfer to place in the top-10 in the tournament.

Week of Sept. 29-Oct. 5: Kristen Hansen, Western Washington (Jr., Spokane, WA – Mead) had rounds of 72, 71 and 75 to finish with a five-over par 218 total and finish seventh in the Golfweek Division II Fall Invitational at Sunriver, Ore.

Week of Oct. 6-12: Jennifer Lienes, Saint Martin's So., Olympia, WA) cruised to a 15-stroke victory in the Saint Martin's Invitational at the Olympia Golf & Country Club. Lienes, who played her freshman season at the University of Washington, had rounds of 74 and 70 on the par-73, 5,800 yard layout to finish 15 shots ahead of second-place Mackenzie Field of Simon Fraser, who had rounds of 80 and 79. The Saints finished with a 36-hole team score of 632, outdistancing the Clan by 30 shots.

Week of Oct. 13-19: Audrey Orem, Western Washington (So., Bellingham, WA) finished third in the Dixie State Invitational leading the Vikings to the team title at the Sunbrook Golf Course in St. George, Utah, shooting rounds of 72 and 79. The 72 was Orem's best round of the season. She currently ranks fourth in the GNAC with a 77.7 average.

Week of Oct. 20-26: Jenn Paul, Western Washington (Fr., Bellingham, WA) finished the GNAC's fall season with the lowest scoring average (74.0) after shooting rounds of 70 and 78 at the Foxtail Golf Club in Rohnert Park, Calif. Paul tied for third on the par-72, 5,812 yard layout leading the Vikings to a second-place team finish in the Sonoma State Fall Preview.

Week of Oct. 27-Nov. 2: Jennifer Lienes, Saint Martin's (So., Olympia, WA) placed third at the Dennis Rose Invitational in Hawaii with a 54-hole score of 231. Lienes had rounds of 79, 75 and 77 to complete her fall season with a stroke average of 75.3, third best in the GNAC.

Week of Feb. 23-Mar. 1: Jennifer Lienes, Saint Martin's (So., Olympia, WA) tied for ninth at the St. Edwards Invitational, carding a two-round score of 155. She carded a first round score of 74, placing her second after the opening round. It was her third top-10 finish of the season.

Week of Mar. 2-8: Jennifer Lienes, Saint Martin's (Jr., Olympia, Wash.) had the top score by a GNAC golfer in the Cal State East Bay Tim Tierney Pioneer Shootout at Hiddenbrooke Golf Course in Vallejo, Calif. Lienes led Saint Martin's with a two-round total 156 to finish 19th out of 83 golfers. She shot a 76 in the first round and 80 in round two. As a team, the Saints finished 11th with a two-round score 657, just three shots back of 10th place Simon Fraser.

Week of Mar. 9-15: Samantha Miller, Northwest Nazarene, tied for seventh place at the Corban Spring Invitational with a identical scores of 80 in all three rounds for a final score of 240. It was her first top-10 finish of the year.

Week of Mar. 16-22: Jennifer Lienes, Saint Martin's (Jr., Olympia, WA) recorded a first-round score of 79 to propel her to a tie for 16th at the Augustana Spring Fling in Palm Desert, Calif., Thursday and Friday. After her 79 on Day 1, Lienes was tied for sixth at the event which featured three nationally ranked teams. She finished the tournament carding a 162 (+18) while being the only GNAC golfer to finish in the Top 30.

Week of Mar. 23-29: Audrey Orem, Western Washington (So., Bellingham, WA) and Jenn Paul, Western Washington (Fr., Bellingham, WA). The Vikings duo each carded a round of 79 and 80 to tie for 21st at the Cal State Monterey Bay Otter Invitational. The pair were the only GNAC golfers to post a round in the 70s.

Week of Mar. 30-Apr. 5: Sammy Walter, Montana State Billings (Fr., Billings, MT) finished in the top 20 in her two events played last week. In Monday and Tuesday's MSUB Spring Invitational, Walter recorded 18 pars and five birdies to place third – her highest finish of the year. The freshman was the highest finisher on her team that ran away with the tournament title, beating the field by 45 strokes. Three days later, Walter and the MSUB team were competing at the Western New Mexico Invitational in Goodyear, Ariz. In the 96-player event, Walter recorded her second top 20 finish by placing 19th with 16 pars and six birdies. She was also the second highest GNAC finisher at the event. Shooting a 154 in each tournament lowered her average round to 81.2, tied for second on the team.

Week of Apr. 6-12: Jenn Paul, Western Washington (Fr., Bellingham, WA) was the top GNAC finisher at the Sonoma State West Regional Spring Preview Monday and Tuesday. Paul shot a 76 in the second round to finish the tournament at 157, tying for 19th place in the 95-player event. She was one of only two WWU golfers to score a round in the 70s as she improved by five strokes on Day 2.
