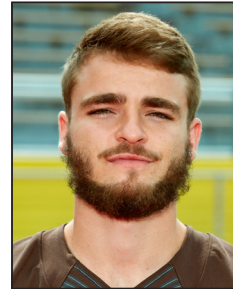

OFFENSIVE

Anthony Lawrence, San Diego

Junior (RS) | Quarterback
La Mesa, California

Lawrence paced San Diego to a school-record 706 offensive yards in a 63-7 PFL title clinching win at Davidson, Saturday. He completed 24-of-28 passes for 403 yards and three touchdowns in less than three full quarters as he left after USD took a 49-7 lead in the third. Lawrence averaged 16.8 yards per completion, including a touchdown tosses of 15, 8 and 25 yards to three different receivers. Two of his receivers – Priest and Bandy – finished with 100-yard receiving outings while Ross Dwelley finished with 99 yards receiving after catching a 58-yard pass in the game. It is Lawrence's first 400-yard passing performance this season and ranks as the fourth-best in the PFL this season by passing yardage.

DEFENSIVE

Willie Barrett, Marist

Junior | Linebacker
Holiday, Florida

Barrett filled in the stat sheet to help Marist end its four-game losing streak with a 38-31 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. His totals were impressive enough, finishing with seven tackles (two solo), 2.5 tackles for loss, 0.5 sacks, a fumble forced, two fumbles recovered and a pass breakup. His first big play was a strip-sack and recovery in the fourth quarter to set up a Marist drive that resulted in the game-winning score. Barrett closed the deal with another fumble recovery on Morehead State's final drive. He also had a pass breakup deep in Marist territory early in the second quarter, helping force a Morehead State field goal that only tied the game.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Dimitrios Lastonas, Valparaiso

Sophomore | Kicker
Westmont, Illinois

Lastonas converted three field goals to help Valparaiso claim the Hoosier Helmet with a 36-28 victory against Butler, Saturday. He finished with 12 points in the contest, adding three PATs to his three field-goal outing. Lastonas opened the day with two PATs before nailing a 40-yard field goal in the first quarter for a 17-3 Valparaiso lead. His last two field goals came in the fourth quarter, a 37-yard boot for a 30-17 lead and a 23-yard conversion to push the lead to 36-25. Lastonas has made a program record 35 PATs this season and is 11-for-13 on field goals.

- **MARCELLUS CALHOUN, RB (Marist)** – Rushed for 2 touchdowns and amassed 155 all-purpose yards (98 rushing on 23 carries) in Marist victory.
- **CONRAD FONSECA, DB (Stetson)** – Amassed 12 tackles (9 solo) along with 2 tackles for loss, including a fumble forced and recovered on a TFL.
- **MATIAS GASC, P (Stetson)** – Averaged 41.5 yards on his six punts, including a 51-yarder and saw two downed inside the 20-yard line.
- **GRANT KRAEMER, QB (Drake)** – Passed for 369 yards and 3 touchdowns, became fifth Bulldogs quarterback with 2,000 passing yards in back-to-back seasons.
- **JALIN LeANDRE, DB (Valparaiso)** – Intercepted a pass, had 2 pass breakups and 7 tackles. His interception included a 30-yard return to set up a Valparaiso TD.
- **LAWSON PAGE, QB (Morehead State)** – Ran for a score and passed for a score, finishing with a career-best 427 passing yards on 31-of-51 passing.
- **DONALD PARHAM, TE (Stetson)** – Caught 11 passes for 165 yards and Stetson's lone touchdown, third best receiving yardage total in PFL this season.
- **JACK RYAN, LB (Campbell)** – Posted PFL weekly best 15 tackles (3 solo) with 3 tackles for loss, including an assist on a sack.
- **JIMMY SEEWALD, QB (Valparaiso)** – Had 285 passing yards and 3 touchdowns, moved into Valparaiso's Top 5 in single-season passing yardage.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

PFL's 25TH CAMPAIGN | The 2017 season marks the 25th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2017 NCAA FCS Championship.

TOREROS CLAIM NINTH PFL TITLE, LEAGUE'S AQ SPOT | San Diego clinched its ninth PFL title all-time in Week 11. The Toreros also have won four straight league crowns and all nine of their titles have come since winning the 2005 championship. San Diego also won the PFL's automatic qualifying spot in the upcoming NCAA Division I Football Championship.

SAN DIEGO EXTENDS PFL RECORD WIN STREAK | San Diego posted its 20th consecutive PFL victory with a Week 11 win at Drake. It is the second longest active conference win streak in Division I entering Week 11, trailing only Ohio Valley Conference member Jacksonville State's 31-game conference win streak.

VALPARAISO SEEKS RARIFIED AIR | Valparaiso's resurgence saw it post a fourth PFL victory when it defeated Butler to win the Hoosier Helmet in Week 11. With the win, the Crusaders posted a fifth overall win for the first time since 2007 and a fourth league victory for the first time since 1968. Valparaiso seeks a winning season for the first time since 2003 but will have to down a Dayton team it has just two wins against all time.

CAMEL'S SMITH IS FCS' LEADING RUSHER | Campbell quarterback Daniel Smith's 289-yard rushing performance against Davidson in Week 10 catapulted him atop the FCS rushing leaders. He finished the season (Campbell is off in Week 12) with a FCS-leading 1,269 rushing yards while he ranks second nationally with 126.9 yards per game. Smith also finished his season ranked fourth in rushing touchdowns (12) and leading all FCS runners with 9.13 yards per carry.

TOREROS PETERSEN LEADS THREE FCS LISTS | San Diego fifth-year defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen, a Buck Buchanan Award Watch List member, enters Week 12 as the FCS leader in sacks (1.20 per game) and tackles for loss (1.90) while ranking second in fumbles forced (0.50 per game). Among FCS active career leaders, he ranks No. 1 in total sacks (38.0), sacks per game (0.84) and tackles for loss (1.51) as well as No. 3 in forced fumbles per game (0.31).

DUGGER'S RICE RESUME | Davidson freshman running back Wesley Dugger also was named to the Jerry Rice Watch List. He is ranked No. 8 among FCS runners in rushing yardage (1,020 yards), No. 10 in rushing yards per game (102.0) and No. 4 in total carries (205).

LAWRENCE MAKING PAYTON AWARD PUSH | San Diego junior quarterback Anthony Lawrence also was named to Walter Payton Award Watch List. He enters Week 12 ranked among the FCS Top 50 in 11 statistical categories, including No. 2 in passing touchdowns (28), No. 3 in both passing efficiency (175.7) and completion percentage (68.8) and No. 6 in yards per pass attempt (9.07). Lawrence owns a career 160.95 pass efficiency rating that ranks No. 3 among NCAA career active leaders.

FLYERS TO THE BLOCK | Dayton blocked its sixth kick of the season in its Week 9 contest against Butler. The Flyers end their season ranked third among FCS teams in blocked kicks. Redshirt freshman Matt Clifford blocked two kicks in 2017, one of only 23 FCS defenders to block multiple kicks.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSES | Five PFL teams having recorded multiple defensive touchdowns in 2017. Campbell leads the way with four defensive scores while Butler, Marist, Stetson and Valparaiso have turned in two defensive touchdowns this season. Campbell is one of 14 FCS squads with four or more defensive touchdowns this season.

CAMELS DEFEND THE AIR | Campbell picked off a FCS-best 19 passes through the end of its 2017 season. Individually, Carlos Merritt (7th, 0.5 per game) is ranked among the FCS Top 10 in interceptions per game.

FEAR THE KICK RETURNERS | The PFL boasts four kick returners among the FCS Top 15 in combined kick return yardage, the most of any FCS conference. Morehead State's Jauneya Tarver is ranked No. 2 among all FCS returners with 1,039 yards. He is joined in the Top 15 by Davidson's Williams Wicks (7th, 798), Dayton's Christian Searles (8th, 798) and Valparaiso's Bailey Gessinger (10th, 772).

2017 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

YOUNG RUSHING LEADERS | The PFL's youth has run rampant in 2017, with three of the league's freshmen runners ranked among the FCS Top 25 in rushing yards per game. Campbell quarterback Daniel Smith ranks No. 2 among all FCS runners with 126.9 yards per game with Davidson's running back Wesley Dugger ranking No. 10 (102.0 ypg) and San Diego freshman Emilio Martinez checking in at No. 21 (84.7 ypg).

YINGER PROVING EXPERIENCE HAS ITS PLACE | Dayton senior running back Tucker Yinger rounds out a quartet of PFL runners in the FCS Top 25 with his 100.5 yards per game ranking 14th among FCS runners (third in the PFL).

DOLPHINS DO RUN | A look at the NCAA FCS team leaders reveals Jacksonville's offense is the subdivision's No. 4 rushing offense, averaging 275.4 yards per game on the ground. The Dolphins rank No. 4 in team rush attempts (542) and No. 15 in yards per rush (5.08).

MARIST'S JOHNSON 1ST TO RETURN KICK FOR SCORE | Marist's Mekhai Johnson became the first PFL return specialist to return a kickoff for a touchdown in 2017, turning in the score against Jacksonville in Week 4. He remains the only PFL return man to post a kickoff return touchdown in 2017.

RETURNS TO THE HOUSE | Five of the nation's return men to take a punt back for a touchdown reside in the PFL. Stetson's JJ Henderson, Davidson's Austin Wells, Dayton's Christian Searles, Campbell's Jaquan Brooks and Valparaiso's John Regan have each put six on the board after fielding a punt in 2017.

PFL DUO NAB NATIONAL HONORS IN WEEK 10 | Campbell's Daniel Smith and Jacksonville's Trevor Tufano each earned FCS Stats National Player of the Week honors in Week 10. Smith rushed for 289 yards and four touchdowns as Campbell downed Davidson. Tufano intercepted a pass in the end zone and forced two fumbles to help Jacksonville hold off Valparaiso.

TWO PFL ROOKIES NAMED TO RICE AWARD WATCH LIST | Campbell quarterback Daniel Smith and Davidson running back Wesley Dugger were among 17 freshmen named to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List, Oct. 25.

DAYTON'S CHAMBERLIN BREAKS MENTOR'S MARK | Dayton head coach Rich Chamberlin notched his 56th PFL victory in his 75th league game, Oct. 7, when the Flyers defeated Drake. He broke the PFL record for coaching victories set by his former head coach Mike Kelley, who posted 55 league wins (71 games) during his storied career. They are the only two coaches in PFL history to record 50 league wins.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 464 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which has extended the streak to 464 games. That streak includes 269 games as a FCS member second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 380 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds the nation's longest streak of games without being shutout at 370, dating back to the 1988 season. The Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

SIX PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS | Campbell kicker/punter Brian Stryffeler, Davidson quarterback Taylor Mitchell, Dayton linebacker Jack Crain, Marist running back Marcellus Calhoun, San Diego nickelback Max Michaels and Stetson tight end Austin Tyrrell were among 181 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation and is prominently displayed inside its official home at the New York Athletic Club.

SMITH PUNTS WAY TO NATIONAL HONOR | Dayton junior kicker Sean Smith became the second PFL athlete to earn national weekly honors, Oct. 8, when he was named the STATS FCS Special Teams Player of the Week. His 43.0 yards per punt against Drake saw five of his seven tries downed inside the Drake 20-yard line and two booming for more than 50 yards.

WOODS FIRST PFL ATHLETE TO EARN NATIONAL HONOR | Campbell running back Montel Goods became the first Pioneer Football League athlete to earn a weekly national honor in 2017, earning STATS FCS National Freshman of the Week, Monday. His three touchdown outing moved him atop the PFL leaderboard in rushing touchdowns this season, his five scores matching Valparaiso's Cody Boxrucker with both ranked 11th among FCS runners.

NEW NAME FOR BUTLER HOME FACILITY | The longtime home for Butler football received a new name in September when the Butler Bowl was renamed the Sellick Bowl in honor of longtime supporters Winstan and Jacqueline Sellick. The renaming was in recognition of a \$9.4-million gift from their estate to the university, shared among the athletics department, the Lacy School of Business and the university.

FIVE PFL ALUMNI ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS | The opening week of NFL action saw five PFL alumni listed on NFL active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville) returned to their teams for 2017. Drake's Eric Saubert (Atlanta), San Diego's Jamal Agnew (Detroit) and Stetson's Donald Payne (Jacksonville) are the league's newest alumni to make an NFL roster in 2017.

PFL TO NFL ALUMNI UPDATE

- Terrence Fede (Miami) has played in eight games this season, mostly on special teams, with eight tackles to his credit.
- Jason Myers (Jacksonville) played in six games this season converted 11 of his 15 field-goal attempts, including 5-of-5 on kicks from 40-49 yards, and 15-of-17 PATs.
- Eric Saubert (Atlanta) has played in nine games this season and listed as the Falcons No. 3 tight end.
- Jamal Agnew (Detroit) has played nine games this season with five tackles to his credit.
- Donald Payne (Jacksonville) has played in seven games this season and has seven tackles to his credit.

PFL ALUMNUS ON CFL ACTIVE ROSTER | In addition to its five NFL alumni, the PFL currently has one alumnus on a Canadian Football League roster this season.

- Matthew Shiltz (Montreal via Butler) played four games in his rookie season for the Alouettes, finishing the season with 470 total offensive yards.

EIGHT FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD | San Diego, the defending PFL Champion, returns four First-Team All-PFL selections among its seven preseason picks, including quarterback Anthony Lawrence. Dayton, last season's PFL runner up, had two returning first-team selections on the team while Campbell and Marist return one first-teamer each.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the seventh consecutive year, the University of San Diego has been picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which won the 2016 regular-season title then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2017 PFL title. The Toreros were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes and also claimed all but two of the possible second-place votes.

TWO PFL ALUMNI SELECTED IN 2017 NFL DRAFT | In a milestone moment for the Pioneer Football League, Drake tight end Eric Saubert and San Diego defensive back Jamal Agnew were each selected in the fifth round of the 2017 NFL Draft. The PFL was one of five Division I FCS conferences to have two players selected in the draft. The PFL joined the Colonial Athletic Association, Big Sky Conference, Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Southwestern Athletic Conference with two selections while the entire FCS saw 15 players drafted.

THREE NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | Three Pioneer Football League student athletes were among the 100 named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team. San Diego junior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney was a second-team selection while teammate senior defensive lineman Jonathan Petersen was joined on the third team by Drake punt returner Terry Wallen.

FIVE PFL ATHLETES NOMINATED FOR 2017 ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 146 nominees from across the country for the 26th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Isaak Newhouse (Butler), Ryan Samuels (Davidson) and Lawrence Dickens (Marist) were nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

TOREROS CHARGE TO 2016 FCS OPENING ROUND WIN | San Diego became the first PFL team to win a game in the Division I Football Championship with its 35-21 victory at Cal Poly, last season. The Toreros win came in just the fourth season of the PFL's automatic bid into the championship.
