OFFENSIVE

Juston Christian, Marist

Senior | Wide Receiver

Christian amassed 274 receiving yards – the most by an FCS receiver this season – in Marist’s 34-24 loss at Columbia, Saturday. He was responsible for each of the Red Foxes three touchdowns and had a hand on 274 of their 341 team offensive yards. He scored twice in the first quarter, opening with a 61-yard touchdown reception from Jacob Hallenbeck, then added a 12-yard touchdown pass from Mike Husni to give Marist a 14-10 lead. He would then give the Red Foxes a 21-17 lead with an 84-yard TD reception early in the third quarter. Christian had five receptions of 20-plus yards, including three receptions of 50-plus yards. His 274 receiving yards fell one yard shy of the PFL record set by Rob Giancola in 2003.

DEFENSIVE

Another stout Drake defensive effort was led by Clayberg’s five-tackle performance in a 36-6 PFL victory against Butler, Saturday. Clayberg’s five-tackle (four solo) outing included a pair of solo tackles for loss, including a solo sack on his first stop of the day. He led a Drake defensive effort that held Butler to 253 offensive yards, including a season-low 134 passing yards.

Butz’ 51-yard punt return for a touchdown gave Dayton a lead it would not relinquish in a 53-20 PFL victory against Valparaiso, Saturday. His return came just minutes after Dayton gained a two-touchdown advantage and the Flyers defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing Valparaiso possession. Butz finished with 118 all-purpose yards: 55 on punt returns, four on kick returns and 60 in receiving. All his receiving yards came on the final score of the first half, a 60-yard catch-and-carry that put Dayton ahead 31-13. Butz also had two special teams tackles on the day.

2018 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

WEEK 7 QUICK THOUGHTS | Looking ahead to Week 7, the marquee matchup will take place on the west coast when Dayton visits San Diego... PFL co-leader San Diego will put not only the nation's longest home win streak on the line but also FCS' second-longest conference win streak... The Toreros last PFL loss came in 2015 to the Dayton program that comes calling this week and is fresh off a 53-point outburst at Valparaiso that included a program-record 37-point first half... Drake, the PFL's other co-leader, has allowed just 15 points in its first two PFL contests and will host a Stetson team back on the road after an off week and looking to rebound from its Week 5 loss at San Diego that saw the Hatters held to 89 rushing yards... With five wins already in 2018, Davidson will seek its first six-win season since 2007 when it hosts a Morehead State team seeking its first PFL win of the year but has won its last six meetings against the Wildcats... The annual Hoosier Helmet battle will unfold when Butler travels to Valparaiso, the Bulldogs are 3-0 this season when scoring 20 or more points while the Crusaders are 0-4 when scoring 20 or more points... Marist will make its second trip to the Sunshine State this season when it visits Jacksonville; the Red Foxes last foray into Florida saw them fall by a narrow 19-14 decision to Stetson while the Dolphins return home seeking their first PFL win of 2018.

TOREROS NOW OWN NATION'S #1 HOME WIN STREAK | With James Madison's home loss, Oct. 6, San Diego has become the FCS team with the longest home win streak. The Toreros own a 18-game home winning streak that dates back to a season-ending loss in 2014 (Cal Poly). San Diego will put that streak on the line this weekend when Dayton visits the west coast.

USD'S LAWRENCE SEVENTH TO 10,000 YARDS | San Diego's Anthony Lawrence became the seventh PFL quarterback to pass for more than 10,000 career yards during Week 6 at Morehead State. With 10,126 yards he became the second San Diego quarterback to reach the milestone, joining Mason Mills (10,204 yards, 2010-13). The PFL record for career passing yards is 11,230 yards held by Jacksonville's Josh McGregor.

DAYTON'S YINGER ON DOORSTEP TO 3,000 YARDS | Meanwhile, Dayton running back Tucker Yinger will seek to move past the 3,000 career rushing yard mark. Entering Week 7 with 2,987 career rushing yards, he would become the 12th PFL rusher to reach the milestone. He would join Connor Kacsor (3,528 yards) as the only Dayton runners to breach 3,000 career rushing yards.

RED FOXES' CHRISTIAN SEEKS RECEIVERS RECORD | Marist wideout Juston Christian is on his way to setting the PFL record for most career receiving yards, entering Week 7 with 3,473 yards receiving - taking over the FCS lead among active career leaders. He needs 332 yards to break the record set by Valparaiso's Rob Giancola (3,804 yards, 2001-04). He is only the sixth receiver in league history to amass 3,000 career receiving yards.

CAN TEMPLE JOIN RECEIVING RANKS? | While the 3,000 career receiving yard club only has six members currently, Butler's Pace Temple seeks to join the group. With 2,681 career yards entering Week 7, he stands a good chance of becoming lucky number seven.

FIVE NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST | Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes have been named as semifinalists for the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Fidelity Investments and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. That quintet joins a group that now includes 77 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CHAMBERLIN FIRST COACH TO 60 PFL WINS | Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin became the first coach to win 60 PFL contests when the Flyers defeated Davidson in Week 4. Chamberlin became the PFL's all-time wins leader last season, passing his longtime mentor Mike Kelley who held the record since 2007.

SAN DIEGO SEEKS EXTENDS PFL RECORD WIN STREAK | San Diego extended its PFL record win streak in conference-only games to 23 games with its win at Valparaiso. San Diego's last PFL loss was a 13-12 loss to Dayton on Oct. 10, 2015 in Dayton, Ohio, which it followed with back-to-back 8-0 PFL campaigns in 2016 and 2017. It is the second longest active FCS conference winning streak behind Jacksonville State's 35-game win streak in Ohio Valley Conference play.

FOUR PFL ALUMNI DOT NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS ON OPENING DAY | As the National Football League season began, four Pioneer Football League alumni were on active rosters across the league. In addition, two other league alumni were on their team's reserved roster or PUP list. The complete list of PFL alumni in the NFL can be found in the box at the right.

LEISRING LONE FCS REP ON LOTT IMPACT TROPHY WATCH LIST | Dayton's David Leisring is the lone FCS representative named to the 2018 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List. Established by The Pacific Club IMPACT Foundation, the Lott IMPACT Trophy honors college football's best in character and performance. The IMPACT award is awarded annually to individuals who demonstrate excellence in the field of athletics and recognizes college football's Defensive Player of the Year who best exemplifies the IMPACT acronym: Integrity, Maturity, Performance, Academics, Community and Tenacity.

TEMPLE TAKES NATIONAL OFFENSIVE HONOR IN WEEK 1 | Butler wideout Pace Temple led all FCS receivers with 14 catches and recorded 167 receiving yards and a touchdown to lead the Bulldogs past nationally-ranked Youngstown State in Week 1. In addition to his offensive duties, Temple recovered a pivotal on-side kick late in the fourth quarter to set up Butler's game-winning drive.

BEVELHIMER & DONLEY NAMED TO MITCHELL AWARD WATCH LIST | Butler's Drew Bevelhimer and Drake's Danny Donley were each named to the 2018 Fred Mitchell Award Watch List just prior to the season starting. The kickers were two of 34 placekickers from the FCS, Division II, Division III and NAIA ranks to earn a spot on the award's preseason list which recognizes placekickers for their excellence on the field and their continued community service.

BUTLER WIN ENDS PFL'S LONG DROUGHT AGAINST MVFC | Butler's Week 1 win at Youngstown State was the first win by a PFL member against a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference since 2007 when Drake defeated Illinois State.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK HITS 469 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 469 games against Davidson. That streak includes 274 games as a FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 384 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 375, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

12 FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRESEASON SQUAD | The 31-member Preseason All-PFL squad was loaded with 12 First-Team All-PFL selections from the 2017 season returning. Seven of those first-team returnees are on offense with the San Diego quarterback Anthony Lawrence, the 2017 PFL Offensive Player of the Year, highlighting the group. Marist linebacker Willie Barrett is one of three 2017 First-Team All-PFL picks returning on defense while Dayton punter Sean Smith is one of two returning first-team honorees. Six different teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | For the eighth consecutive year, the San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. The Toreros, which have won regular-season title and then advanced to the second round of the FCS Championship in back-to-back seasons, were chosen just ahead of Dayton in polling that was dominated by the two teams. San Diego and Dayton combined to receive all available first-place votes (coaches could not vote for their own team). The Toreros received a maximum nine first-place votes to finish with 81 points of the maximum 100 points possible. The Flyers earned the other first-place vote and finished with 72 points.

COONEY NAMED TO FOUR FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUADS | San Diego senior offensive lineman Daniel Cooney received plenty of national preseason attention, earning recognition on four preseason All-America teams. The STATS FCS, Athlon Sports, Phil Steele FCS Magazine and Hero Sports groups each recognized the 6-8, 315-pound lineman from Western Springs, Illinois on their respective preseason squads.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM | Four Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 169 nominees from across the country for the 27th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Drew Bevelhimer (Butler), Nathan Clayberg (Drake), Jake Dempsey (Jacksonville) and Kyle Hamrick (Stetson) were nominated for the 2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PFL'S 26TH CAMPAIGN | The 2018 season marks the 26th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021 | Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council has agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2018 and 2019 seasons while beginning to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.

PFL ALUMNUS NAMED TO NFL ALL-PRO TEAM | San Diego's Jamal Agnew was named an NFL All-Pro selection by the Associated Press, Pro Football Writers Association and Sports News after an impressive rookie campaign with Detroit. Primarily a return specialist for the Lions, Agnew finished 2017 leading the NFL with 447 punt return yards while scoring two punt return touchdowns.
