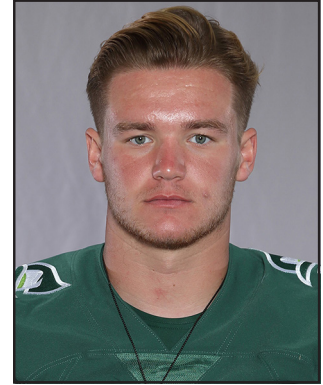

OFFENSIVE

Gaven DiFilippo, Stetson

DeFilippo was responsible for five touchdowns in less than three quarters as Stetson downed Division II North Carolina Wesleyan, 55-21, Saturday. Staying on through just the first drive of the second half, DiFilippo completed 21-of-24 passes for 176 yards and three touchdowns while also rushing for two touchdowns on five carries totaling 51 yards. After North Carolina Wesleyan raced out to a 13-0 lead, DiFilippo got Stetson on the board with his first rushing touchdown. He closed the first half with three second-quarter touchdown throws. In his lone drive of the second half, DiFilippo ran in from 19 yards out to close his outing with Stetson leading 45-14. He has not thrown an interception in 2019, completing 94 of 141 passes.

DEFENSIVE

Proctor's late second quarter interception put Drake in position for a quick touchdown before halftime in a 41-17 PFL victory, Saturday. Proctor's first notable action was an interception with under 30 seconds left that he returned 54 yards to the Marist 21-yard line. Two plays later, Drake scored a touchdown to extend its lead to 27-3. He also had three tackles, including one for a loss, in the win.

Wilson's scoop-and-score of a blocked punt in the first half was a key insurance touchdown in a 55-21 victory against North Carolina Wesleyan. After Stetson grabbed its first lead 14-10, Davion Maxwell blocked a punt deep in North Carolina Wesleyan territory and Wilson picked up the loose ball and returned it 12 yards for a touchdown. It was Stetson's first special teams touchdown since 2017.

WEEK 5 QUICK SNAPS

📍 JACKSONVILLE AT DAYTON, NOON

The PFL's No. 4 passing offense (Dayton) squares off against the No. 3 rushing offense (Jacksonville) in the PFL opener for both teams, Saturday, at Welcome Stadium. Two different styles of quarterback will be on display with passer Jack Cook, who is third in the PFL with 236.0 passing yards per game, against runner Calvin Turner Jr., who is second in the PFL with 94.5 rushing yards per game. Last season, Dayton unleashed its run game to the tune of 307 yards and three touchdowns while Jacksonville amassed 266 rushing yards but did not score a touchdown on the ground. **DOLPHIN TO WATCH:** Linebacker Caysaun Wakeley is one of only three PFL defenders with an interception return for a touchdown this season and ranks fourth among PFL linebackers with 7.2 tackles per game. **FLYER TO WATCH:** Tight end Adam Trautman has been vitally important to the offense this season, catching 25 of Cook's 53 completions and 303 of the team's 708 passing yards.

📍 DAVIDSON AT MOREHEAD STATE, 1 P.M.

Two offenses that have each averaged more than 400 yards per game meet when Davidson meets Morehead State, Saturday, at Jayne Stadium. Once again, Davidson's ground game has been impressive in 2019, averaging 329.8 yards and more than three touchdowns per game – all without an individual runner averaging more than 75 yards per game. Morehead State has been a more balanced offensive unit (186.8 rush yards vs. 215.5 pass yards per game) and has the league's leading rusher in Issiah Aguero and third ranked passer in Mark Pappas. **WILDCAT TO WATCH:** Pick a Wildcat to run and odds are you'll be right with seven runners with 10 or more carries and 19 Wildcats with a carry. Toss in nine different Wildcat runners who have scored a touchdown and Davidson's run game is a multifaceted threat. **EAGLE TO WATCH:** Issiah Aguero is the PFL's leading rusher at 95.0 yards per game but also in third in the all-purpose yardage race with 120.0 yards per game. Yet he only has two touchdowns to his credit in 2019, both through the run game.

📍 BUTLER AT STETSON, 1 P.M.

One of the FCS' longest home win streaks will be put on the line when Stetson, winner of its last nine home games, hosts Butler. Stetson's offense has been a prolific scoring machine with 50 or more points in three of its first four games, but that unit was held to 23 points in a PFL-opening loss to Marist. Meanwhile, Butler's offense is working to find its stride entering its PFL lid-lifter with a 30-point outing against Indiana Wesleyan its high-water mark to date. **BULLDOG TO WATCH:** Linebacker Luke Sennett will be the focus of Butler's efforts to slow the Stetson passing game, with his team-leading four pass breakups while also leading the Bulldogs with 8.0 tackles per game. **HATTER TO WATCH:** Quarterback Gaven DiFilippo has jumped out to an impressive start in 2019 with 11 touchdown throws in four games. However, more impressively he has not thrown an interception in his league-leading 141 pass attempts this season.

📍 VALPARAISO AT DRAKE, 2 P.M.

Fresh off its PFL-opening win at Marist last week, Drake returns to Iowa looking to move to 2-0 in league play when it hosts Valparaiso. After being bottled up in its first three weekends, Drake's offense broke out for a season-best 41 points at Marist last week and posting 442 offensive yards in the game after entering the outing with 658 total yards in its previous three games. Valparaiso is another squad looking to find its way on offense, averaging just 208 offensive yards per game entering this week's matchup. **CRUSADER TO WATCH:** Wide receiver Ollie Reese has done his most to give Valparaiso good field position as both a punt and kick returner in addition to his normal receiving duties. He has 285 kick return yards (20.4 per return) and 118.2 all-purpose yards per game this season. **BULLDOG TO WATCH:** Quarterback Ian Corwin got recognition as the FCS' top freshman last week and it was senior wide receiver Shane Feller that caught the bulk of the receptions – six catches for 102 yards and a touchdown.

📍 MARIST AT SAN DIEGO, 5 P.M.

A 29-game PFL win streak is put on the line for the first time in 2019 when San Diego opens its PFL run against a Marist squad with two PFL games under its belt. San Diego's offense has not skipped a beat under quarterback Reid Sinnett, reaching 30 points in each of its first three games while Sinnett has already posted 1,039 passing yards in his first three games under center. Marist put a season-best 26 points on the board in its PFL-opening win against Stetson but a 17-point outing against Drake did not provide the same result. **RED FOX TO WATCH:** Wide receiver Anthony Olivencia broke out with a 150-yard receiving day against Stetson but has been limited to 157 total receiving yards in his last two outings. He has found the end zone in two of his last three games played. **TORERO TO WATCH:** Having the PFL's No. 1 & No. 2 receivers (in passing yardage) is a sign of the weapons Sinnett has at his disposal. Wideout Dalton Kincaid has been the big-play threat in 2019 with his 14 receptions going for 311 yards, or a league-leading 22.2 yards per reception.

PFL WELL REPRESENTED ON CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST

Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named as semifinalists for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Mazda and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The five PFL student-athletes recognized as semifinalists were: Brad Sznajder, Butler; Ethan Steinbacher, Davidson; Tim Simon, Dayton; Andrew McElroy, Marist; and Gaven DeFilippo, Stetson. That quintet joins a group that now includes 82 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CORWIN NAMED STATS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Drake freshman Ian Corwin put it all together in his best performance and Drake's first win of the season, 41-17 at Marist, Sept. 28. Corwin completed 20 of 29 passes (69 percent) for 255 yards and four touchdowns with one interception. The four touchdown passes went to four different receivers and were one more than he threw in the first three games combined.

DUGGER VAULTS PAST 2,500 YARDS

Davidson running back Wesley Dugger pushed past the 2,500 career yard mark against Campbell, Sept. 21. One of two juniors among the FCS Top 10 Active Career Leaders, he is ranked fourth in total rushing yardage (2,571) after Week 4, averaging 107.1 yards per game. He is just ahead of Monmouth junior Pete Guerriero (2,419 yards) on the list.

THE EFFICIENT COOK

Seeing a PFL quarterback listed on the FCS Active Career Leaders list in Passing Efficiency is a normal occurrence. However, that quarterback not having San Diego next to their name is a new twist. Dayton signal caller Jack Cook is second among active career leaders with a 156.61 career pass efficiency rating.

BANDY NEXT TO 2,500?

Meanwhile, San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy will look to reach the 2,500 receiving yard plateau when the Toreros return to action in Week 6. He finished Week 4 with 2,481 career reception yards, fifth among NCAA active career leaders.

DAVIDSON'S HATALOWICH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Davidson linebacker George Hatalowich was named to the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Sept. 12. As the founder and current president of Davidson Football Uplifting Athletes, George has been responsible for raising more than \$25,000 to benefit the rare disease community. George has also taken the Davidson Chapter a step further to engage with local patients, families and caregivers through the Uplifting Athletes Bowling event, which allows the families the opportunity to bowl alongside the football team. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team will be invited to the 2020 Allstate® Sugar Bowl® and will join Tebow and Allstate volunteers to give back to New Orleans through a special community service project. Allstate will recognize the team during the halftime show. Fans are invited to visit ESPN.com/Allstate to vote for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team captain once per day, now through Nov. 22. The team captain will be honored at The Home Depot College Football Awards on ESPN later this season.

DAYTON FLIES TO HISTORIC WIN

Facing the No. 14 team in the FCS, Dayton faced daunting odds to win its season opener at Indiana State. But when Sean Prophit scored with 1:57 left the Flyers had an opportunity. Then Zach Rumpke turned that opportunity into reality with a interception to seal the win. It was the highest-ranked FCS opponent a Dayton team had defeated in program history and was the PFL's third win all-time against the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

VALPARAISO'S 100TH SEASON

Valparaiso is set to celebrate its 100-year history over the course of the campaign by recognizing and celebrating individuals and teams from select eras at four games this season. The Crusaders have won 11 conference championships, including six in the Indiana Collegiate Conference and two in the Pioneer Football League. Valparaiso will retire the numbers of two University legends at the Homecoming game on Sept. 28 at Brown Field. Garry Puetz '73 and Fuzzy Thurston '56 (posthumous) will become the first players in program history to have their numbers retired.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK NOW 479 GAMES

The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to Dayton, which extended its streak to 479 games with its win at Robert Morris. That streak includes 284 games as an FCS member that is second among active FCS-only streaks. Montana holds the FCS-only longest streak without being shutout at 396 games which dates back to 1989. On the FBS side, Florida holds that subdivision's longest streak of games without being shutout at 389, dating back to the 1988 season. Meanwhile, the Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

NINE FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRE-SEASON SQUAD

The 29-member Preseason All-PFL squad saw nine First-Team All-PFL selections return from the 2018 season. Three 2018 first-teamers return on offense with San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy leading the unit. Drake defensive back Will Warner leads a group of five 2018 first-team selections on the league's preseason defensive unit. San Diego return specialist Michael Armstead is the lone returning first-team selection on the league's special teams unit. Six PFL teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018: San Diego (3), Drake (2), Davidson, Dayton, Jacksonville and Stetson

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL

For the ninth consecutive year, San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which has won regular-season title each of the past three seasons, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2019 PFL title. With seven first-place votes, the Toreros were chosen ahead of Dayton and Drake, who picked up the remaining three first-place votes.

THREE PFL PUNTERS NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

A trio of Pioneer Football League punters were named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List presented by The Augusta Sports Council. Drake's Ross Kennedy, Morehead State's Andrew Foster and San Diego's Tanner Kuljian were each named to the 28-player list released in July. Each of the three finished 2018 ranked among the NCAA's Top 100 punters in punting average. Kuljian was ranked No. 14 nationally, averaging 42.8 yards per punt on 59 kicks. Foster was No. 26 among FCS kickers with 41.9 yards per punt. Kennedy finished the season No. 93 among FCS punters (37.1 yards per punt).

BANDY, TRAUTMAN, WANRER EARN FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NODS

San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy, Dayton tight end Adam Trautman and Drake defensive back Will Waner made the rounds as the Preseason All-America squads were announced. Bandy was named to all four Preseason All-America teams (STATS, Athlon, Phill Steele and HERO), Warner was named to three (STATS, Phill Steele and HERO) and Trautman earned recognition on two (STATS and Phill Steele).

THIRTY-FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2019 NFF HAMPSHIRE SOCIETY

Thirty-five Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing seven member institutions, were named members of the 2019 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced in April. The NFF's Hampshire Honor Society recognizes those college football players from all divisions of play that maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 137 nominees from across the country for the 28th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. George Hatalowich (Davidson), Luke Butera (Marist) and Ryan Culhane (Dayton) were nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PARADY DEAN OF PFL, FCS COACHES

As 2019 gets underway, the longest-tenured coaches in Division I FCS are Marist's Jim Parady and Monmouth's Kevin Callahan, who have been head coaches at their respective schools since 1992. On the other end of the spectrum, the PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2019: Valparaiso's Landon Fox and Drake's Jeff Stepsis, who were part of 24 new head coaches in the FCS this season.

LANDON FOX TAKES OVER AT VALPARAISO

In March Valparaiso Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera introduced Landon Fox as the 18th head coach of the Crusaders football program. Fox is no stranger to success in the Pioneer Football League, as he spent the 11 previous seasons as Dayton's defensive coordinator and secondary coach. During that time, the Flyers compiled an 86-38 record, won three PFL championships and participated in the 2015 FCS playoffs while making defense a hallmark of the program.

STETSON'S HUGHES EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Coming off the best season in more than 65 years, Stetson football coach Roger Hughes was rewarded with a contract extension that will keep him on the Hatters sideline through at least the 2021 season. Hughes, who has guided the Stetson football program since 2011 when he was charged with leading the program onto the field after more than 50 years without a team, was named Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year in 2018.

DRAKE NAMES STEPSIS HEAD COACH

Todd Stepsis, the architect of the Drake football team's nationally-ranked defense, was named the head coach of the Drake football team in December. He takes the reins of the Bulldogs' program after serving as the program's defensive coordinator for the past five seasons under previous head coach Rick Fox, who resigned his position. As the defensive coordinator, Stepsis built the Drake defense into one of the nation's top units and coached a total of 42 all-conference selections including the program's all-time leading tackler and the 2018 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, Nathan Clayberg.

PFL'S 27TH CAMPAIGN

The 2019 season marks the 27th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021

In 2019, the Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2019 season while continuing to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.
