FCS PLAYOFF PREVIEW

San Diego makes its fourth consecutive Division I Football Championship appearance when it meets Northern Iowa, Saturday, in the tournament's opening round. It is a game that will pit a Torero squad that is the FCS' No. 2 offense (498.8 ypg) against a UNI team that is ranked No. 11 in defense (307.3 ypg). San Diego prefers to air it out with its seventh-ranked passing game (307.6 ypg) that also is No. 2 nationally in pass efficiency (176.19) behind only national No. 1 seed North Dakota State. Meanwhile, UNI has three defensive touchdowns to its credit in 2019 but is ranked No. 50 in pass efficiency defense (128.70), despite limiting opponents to 191.7 passing yards per game (23rd in FCS). The Panthers will lean on its defense with an offense that is averaging only 23.8 points per game (86th in FCS) against USD's 41.7 points per game (3rd in FCS). And lest nay-sayers believe the Toreros scoring average is the result of PFL play, they posted 30-plus points against the likes of Harvard (31), UC Davis (35) and Cal Poly (34) before league play started. Both teams will need to be aware of the other's ball-hawking defense, with San Diego picking off 19 passes while UNI has 14 interceptions to its credit, each unit ranking among the FCS' Top 15 in that category.

TORERO TO WATCH: Reid Sinnett has settled in to the quarterback role this season, entering the postseason ranked No. 2 nationally in pass efficiency (177.9) thanks to Top 5 rankings in completion percentage (4th, 67.8), passing touchdowns (4th, 32), passing yards (9th, 3,341) and yards per completion (8th, 14.59). He has passed for 300 yards five times this season (twice in the first three weeks), and had nine multi-TD pass outings, including back-to-back five touchdown outings.

PANTHER TO WATCH: Elerson Smith will look to make his home in the San Diego backfield as he has for most of 2019. He leads all FCS defenders in forced fumbles (0.42, 5 in 12 games) and is ranked sixth in sacks (1.08 per game) and 18th in tackles for loss (1.5 per game). Smith leads a UNI defensive unit that is averaging 2.83 sacks per game - 17th best among FCS squads.

Binda Jr. tied a program record with four rushing touchdowns in San Diego's 47-28 PFL victory at Jacksonville, Saturday. He carried the ball 26 times without a loss, netting 147 yards while accounting for four of the Toreros' six touchdowns in the game. Binda Jr. opened the game's scoring with a five-yard touchdown. He then added two third-quarter scores helped San Diego maintain the lead before adding a one-yard dash that closed the day's scoring. Six of his runs went for 10-plus yards and seven resulted in a first down. It was Binda Jr.'s third multi-touchdown outing in the regular season's final four weeks.

McElroy's 90-yard interception return for a touchdown secured Marist's 26-14 PFL victory at Valparaiso, Saturday. Leading 19-14, Marist faced Valparaiso threatening at the Red Foxes' 11-yard line. On 2nd-and-10, McElroy picked off a pass and his 90-yard return gave Marist a 12-point lead with 20 seconds remaining. McElroy also batted away a pass on Valparaiso's previous drive, helping to start a crucial three-and-out that set up the Marist offense inside Valparaiso territory and led to a field goal. He also had two tackles in the contest.

Webster posted the second 15-point outing by a kicker in the PFL this season, helping Dayton post a 51-38 victory against Butler, Saturday. Webster connected on field goals from 31, 39 and 30 yards and on each of his six PATs. His first field goal put Dayton ahead 17-3 to end the first quarter and was part of Dayton's 31-0 run to take control of the game. Webster's 39-yarder put Dayton up 48-24 in the third quarter and he followed that with his 30-yarder on the next Flyers possession for a 51-31 lead. He also kicked off twice with one touchback.

PFL AWARDS: DEC. 2-4

The 2019 PFL Awards, All-PFL Teams and Academic All-PFL Teams will be announced during the first week of December. The PFL Awards: Offensive, Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Year, Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year and Coach of the Year will be presented Monday, Dec. 2. The 27th All-PFL Teams arrive Tuesday followed by the Academic All-PFL Teams and the league's Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Wednesday.

SAN DIEGO'S PFL WIN STREAK SECOND LONGEST IN FCS HISTORY

With its win at Jacksonville in Week 13, San Diego's extended its PFL win streak to 37 games. It is the second-longest conference win streak in FCS history, surpassing a 36-game win streak by Jacksonville State of the Ohio Valley Conference (2013-18). It trails a 39-game win streak by Duquesne in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Association (1999-06).

SEVENTEEN PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Eight PFL teams saw a student-athlete named to the 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams, Nov. 14. A total of 17 PFL student-athletes – the most since 2009 – were recognized: Brad Sznajder (Butler), Wesley Dugger (Davidson), Jake Chisholm (Dayton), Nate Obringer (Dayton), Tim Simon (Dayton), Allen Waltz (Dayton), Steven Doran (Drake), Jacob Bacon (Drake), Isaiah Adeyemi-Berglund (Drake), Victor Jergens (Drake), Danny Morales (Drake), Grant Dixon (Marist), Jack Griffith (Marist), Cameron Barrett (Morehead State), Alex Spadone (San Diego), Kama Kamaka (San Diego), Gaven DeFilippo (Stetson) and Colin Wray (Stetson).

DAYTON'S EASTERLING ADDED TO BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Dayton junior safety Brandon Easterling was added to the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award Watch List, Nov. 7. At that time, Easterling led all FCS leaders in tackles per game (13.1), solo tackles (7.6) and was tied for first in fumbles recovered (3). Earlier this season he had 19 tackles against Duquesne, the most by a Dayton player since James Vercammen had 19 at San Diego in 2009. In addition, Easterling had a string of four consecutive games with at least one opponent turnover gained. He has led Dayton in tackles in seven of the eight games this season.

SAN DIEGO'S SINNETT JOINS PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

San Diego quarterback Reid Sinnett was one of 16 players added to the 2019 STATS FCS Walter Payton Award watch list, Nov. 6. In his first season as a starter, Sinnett was the FCS leader in passing efficiency and completion percentage while he was among the top four in passing touchdowns (3rd), passing yards per game (3rd), points responsible for (3rd) and total offense (4th) at the time of the announcement. The redshirt senior's current passing efficiency (186.4) ranked as the fifth-best in FCS history with three weeks remaining in the regular season.

DRAKE'S CORWIN, STETSON'S LEARY NAMED TO INITIAL RICE AWARD WATCH LIST

Drake freshman quarterback Ian Corwin and Stetson freshman running back Jalen Leary were each among the 24 freshmen named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List, Nov. 5. Corwin has completed 129-of-228 passes (56.6 percent) for 1,480 yards and 14 touchdowns. He was named the STATS FCS National Freshman Player of the Week on Sept. 30 after leading Drake to a 41-17 road win over Marist. With 806 rushing yards through eight games, Leary had the second-most single-season rushing yards in modern Stetson history and had three games left to become the first Hatter with 1,000 rushing yards in a season in the modern era.

DAYTON'S TRAUTMAN ACCEPTS SENIOR BOWL INVITE

Dayton tight end Adam Trautman has accepted an invitation to play in the Senior Bowl college all-star game in Mobile, Ala. on Jan. 25, 2020. Senior Bowl Executive Director Jim Nagy extended the invitation personally to Trautman after Dayton's Nov. 6 practice. The Flyer co-captain will be the first Dayton player to play in the Senior Bowl since 1972. Only five other Flyers have played in the Senior Bowl – tight end Fred Dugan (1958), linebacker Email Karas (1959), center Bob DeMarco (1961), center Leo Dillon (1971) and running back Gary Kosins (1972).

DUGGER PUSHES PAST 3,000 YARDS

Davidson running back Wesley Dugger pushed past the 3,000 career yard mark against Marist, Oct. 26. One of two juniors among the FCS Top 10 Active Career Leaders, he is ranked fifth in total rushing yardage (3,424), averaging 107.0 yards per game (3rd among active career leaders). Dugger finished his junior campaign ranked ninth among PFL career rushing yardage leaders.

THE EFFICIENT COOK

Seeing a PFL quarterback listed on the FCS Active Career Leaders list in passing efficiency is a normal occurrence. However, that quarterback not having San Diego next to their name is a new twist. Dayton signal caller Jack Cook finished his career No. 2 on the FCS' active career leader list with a 162.60 career pass efficiency rating. That mark ranks third all-time on the PFL's career pass efficiency list, behind San Diego's Josh Johnson's 176.68 mark (2004-07) and San Diego's Sinnett (below).

SINNETT JOINS EFFICIENCY EFFORT

Cook was joined on the NCAA FCS Active Career Leaders list by San Diego's Reid Sinnett, who qualified for inclusion after Week 11. The Torero signal-caller boasts a 168.16 career pass efficiency rating that would be second-best in PFL history.

BANDY CATCHES 3,000 YARD TRAIN

Meanwhile, San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy moved past the 3,000 receiving yard plateau in Week 9. He now is ranked fourth among FCS active career leaders with 3,282 career receiving yards. Bandy is the ninth PFL receiver to record 3,000 career receiving yards and enters this week seventh all-time, and needs 83 yards to pass Butler's Pace Temple (3,364, 2015-18).

WARNER BACK AMONG FCS CAREER LEADERS

Drake's defensive back Will Warner nabbed four interceptions in a three-week span (Weeks 7-9) and finished his career ranked second on the NCAA's Active Career Leaders list for picks. He finished with 15 career interceptions and was the eighth PFL defender to record 15 career INTs. Morehead State's David Hyland and Dayton's Mark Kasmer hold the PFL record with 21 interceptions each.

CHAMBERLIN RECORDS 500TH GAME AS A FLYER

There are few things that can challenge the longevity of Dayton's scoring streak. However, Rick Chamberlin's tenure as a Flyer surpasses even that streak. When he took up his position on the sideline against San Diego in Week 9 it was his 500th appearance as a Flyer. He played 45 as an All-American linebacker, then 326 games as an assistant coach under College Football Hall of Fame coach Mike Kelly, before taking over for his mentor and now 129 games – and counting – as Dayton's head coach.

VALPARAISO'S BOOKER NAMED STATS FCS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stetson entered the game with the most-potent offense in FCS statistics, but Booker helped Valparaiso stymie the fellow Pioneer Football League squad 19-10 to earn its first win of the season. Booker had 13 tackles (seven solos), two interceptions for the second time this season and a pass breakup. Both picks came inside Valpo's 25, with the first one leading to a go-ahead field goal and the second clinching the win. He had 32 interception return yards. It is the third national STATS FCS honor by a PFL athlete this season.

FOSTER NAMED STATS FCS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Morehead State kicker Andrew Foster became the second PFL athlete to earn STATS FCS weekly honors in 2019, picking up the organization's National FCS Special Teams Player of the Week award after Week 7 action. Foster made three field goals and scored 12 points as Morehead State downed Jacksonville, 30-22, for the first time since 2005. He became the second PFL kicker to convert twice from 40 yards in the same game this season, hitting from 45 and 43 yards while making all three of his field goal attempts.

PFL REPRESENTED AMONG CAMPBELL SEMIFINALISTS

Five Pioneer Football League student-athletes were named as semifinalists for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy presented by Mazada and The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. The five PFL student-athletes recognized as semifinalists were: Brad Sznajder, Butler; Ethan Steinbacher, Davidson; Tim Simon, Dayton; Andrew McElroy, Marist; and Gaven DeFilippo, Stetson. That quintet joins a group that now includes 82 PFL student-athletes who have been named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, or its predecessor the Draddy Trophy, since 1998.

CORWIN NAMED STATS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Drake freshman Ian Corwin put it all together in his best performance and Drake's first win of the season, 41-17 at Marist, Sept. 28. Corwin completed 20 of 29 passes (69 percent) for 255 yards and four touchdowns with one interception. The four touchdown passes went to four different receivers and were one more than he threw in the first three games combined.

DAVIDSON'S HATALOWICH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Davidson linebacker George Hatalowich was named to the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team Sept. 12. As the founder and current president of Davidson Football Uplifting Athletes, George has been responsible for raising more than \$25,000 to benefit the rare disease community. George has also taken the Davidson Chapter a step further to engage with local patients, families and caregivers through the Uplifting Athletes Bowling event, which allows the families the opportunity to bowl alongside the football team. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team will be invited to the 2020 Allstate® Sugar Bowl® and will join Tebow and Allstate volunteers to give back to New Orleans through a special community service project. Allstate will recognize the team during the halftime show. Fans are invited to visit ESPN.com/Allstate to vote for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team captain once per day, now through Nov. 22.

DAYTON FLIES TO HISTORIC WIN

Facing the No. 14 team in the FCS, Dayton faced daunting odds to win its season opener at Indiana State. But when Sean Proffit scored with 1:57 left the Flyers had an opportunity. Then Zach Rumpke turned that opportunity into reality with a interception to seal the win. It was the highest-ranked FCS opponent a Dayton team had defeated in program history and was the PFL's third win all-time against the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

LEANINE FIRST-TEAM ALL-PFL RETURNEES HIGHLIGHT PRESEASON SQUAD

The 29-member Preseason All-PFL squad saw nine First-Team All-PFL selections return from the 2018 season. Three 2018 first-teamers return on offense with San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy leading the unit. Drake defensive back Will Warner leads a group of five 2018 first-team selections on the league's preseason defensive unit. San Diego return specialist Michael Armstead is the lone returning first-team selection on the league's special teams unit. Six PFL teams have a First-Team All-PFL returnee on their roster in 2018: San Diego (3), Drake (2), Davidson, Dayton, Jacksonville and Stetson.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL

For the ninth consecutive year, San Diego was picked to win the Pioneer Football League regular-season race in a preseason vote of the league's coaches. San Diego, which has won regular-season title each of the past three seasons, again received the coaches' nod to win the 2019 PFL title. With seven first-place votes, the Toreros were chosen ahead of Dayton and Drake, who picked up the remaining three first-place votes.

THREE PFL PUNTERS NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

A trio of Pioneer Football League Punters were named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List presented by The Augusta Sports Council. Drake's Ross Kennedy, Morehead State's Andrew Foster and San Diego's Tanner Kuljian were each named to the 28-player list released in July. Each of the three finished 2018 ranked among the NCAA's Top 100 punters in punting average. Kuljian was ranked No. 14 nationally, averaging 42.8 yards per punt on 59 kicks. Foster was No. 26 among FCS kickers with 41.9 yards per punt. Kennedy finished the season No. 93 among FCS punters (37.1 yards per punt).

BANDY, TRAUTMAN, WANER EARN FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA NODS

San Diego wide receiver Michael Bandy, Dayton tight end Adam Trautman and Drake defensive back Will Waner made the rounds as the Preseason All-America squads were announced. Bandy was named to all four Preseason All-America teams (STATS, Athlon, Phill Steele and HERO), Warner was named to three (STATS, Phill Steele and HERO) and Trautman earned recognition on two (STATS and Phill Steele).

THIRTY-FIVE PFL ATHLETES NAMED TO 2019 NFF HAMPSHIRE SOCIETY

Thirty-five Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing seven member institutions, were named members of the 2019 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame announced in April. The NFF's Hampshire Honor Society recognizes those college football players from all divisions of play that maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers.

FOUR NOMINATED FOR ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among 137 nominees from across the country for the 28th edition of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. George Hatalowich (Davidson), Luke Butera (Marist) and Ryan Culhane (Dayton) were nominated for the 2019 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

PARADY DEAN OF PFL, FCS COACHES

As 2019 gets underway, the longest-tenured coaches in Division I FCS are Marist's Jim Parady and Monmouth's Kevin Callahan, who have been head coaches at their respective schools since 1992. On the other end of the spectrum, the PFL welcomes two new head coaches in 2019: Valparaiso's Landon Fox and Drake's Jeff Stepsis, who were part of 24 new head coaches in the FCS this season.

LANDON FOX TAKES OVER AT VALPARAISO

In March Valparaiso Director of Athletics Mark LaBarbera introduced Landon Fox as the 18th head coach of the Crusaders football program. Fox is no stranger to success in the Pioneer Football League, as he spent the 11 previous season as Dayton's defensive coordinator and secondary coach. During that time, the Flyers compiled an 86-38 record, won three PFL championships and participated in the 2015 FCS playoffs while making defense a hallmark of the program.

STETSON'S HUGHES EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Coming off the best season in more than 65 years, Stetson football coach Roger Hughes was rewarded with a contract extension that will keep him on the Hatters sideline through at least the 2021 season. Hughes, who has guided the Stetson football program since 2011 when he was charged with leading the program onto the field after more than 50 years without a team, was named Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year in 2018.

DRAKE NAMES STEPSIS HEAD COACH

Todd Stepsis, the architect of the Drake football team's nationally-ranked defense, was named the head coach of the Drake football team in December. He takes the reins of the Bulldogs' program after serving as the program's defensive coordinator for the past five seasons under previous head coach Rick Fox, who resigned his position. As the defensive coordinator, Stepsis built the Drake defense into one of the nation's top units and coached a total of 42 all-conference selections including the program's all-time leading tackler and the 2018 PFL Defensive Player of the Year, Nathan Clayberg.

PFL'S 27TH CAMPAIGN

The 2019 season marks the 27th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 10 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA FCS Championship.

PRESBYTERIAN TO JOIN PFL IN 2021

In 2019, the Pioneer Football League Commissioner presidents' council agreed to accept Presbyterian College's request for membership, effective for the 2021 season. Presbyterian College's football program will remain a Big South member for the 2019 season while continuing to phase out scholarships in order to obtain PFL eligibility. The Blue Hose will play one season as a Division I independent in 2020 before joining the PFL in 2021.
