CO-OFFENSIVE



Trevor Jones, Morehead State
Freshman (RS) | Running Back
Irvine, Kentucky

Jones ran for 284 yards and four touchdowns in Morehead State's 61-49 PFL loss to Jacksonville. His school-record 284 rushing yards were third most in PFL history (most since Sept. 6, 2014) and second most in the FCS this season. Jones also is the second PFL rusher to rush for four touchdowns this season, tied for most in the FCS this season. Early in the game he had an 83-yard rush to set up a go-ahead touchdown. Jones also broke out for a 61-yard touchdown in the third quarter to get MSU within three points. Seven of his runs went for a first down.



Anthony Lawrence
Sophomore (RS) | Quarterback
La Mesa, California

Lawrence threw a career-high five touchdowns to keep San Diego unbeaten in PFL play with a 49-10 victory against Valparaiso, Saturday. He completed 22-of-32 passes for 301 yards in just over three quarters of action, leaving after his fifth touchdown throw with 14:55 left in the game. His second touchdown pass concluded a drive that saw him attempt a pass on all 10 plays of the drive, and he completed six passes for 89 yards. Lawrence is the third PFL quarterback to pass for five touchdowns.

Belk racked up four tackles for loss to help Stetson secure a 30-24 PFL overtime victory at Campbell, Saturday. He finished the day with six tackles (three solo), but four of those stops came in the backfield (two of those sacks). Belk had a key tackle for loss to keep Campbell out of the end zone on 3rd-and-Goal from the two-yard line on the first drive of the contest. Two drives later, he was credited with a sack and fumble forced in the end zone that was recovered by a teammate for Stetson's first touchdown. Belk led a Stetson defensive line that limited Campbell to a season-low 102 rushing yards.

Payne's blocked field goal and score after a lateral on the ensuing return gave Stetson a 30-24 PFL overtime victory at Campbell, Saturday. With Campbell attempting a 30-yard field goal on the first possession of overtime, Payne broke through the line and blocked the kick. Jeb Bourdeaux recovered the kick and carried it 85 yards before he was caught, but he lateraled the ball to Payne who was on the receiving end and credited with the game-winning touchdown. It capped another active day for Payne, who became the 14th NCAA player at any level to record 500 career tackles (posting 13 in the game) and disrupted a Campbell fourth-quarter PAT, resulting in a failed conversion.

■ San Diego at Marist, 1 p.m.

Setting the Scene: The biggest matchup of Week 9 pits the PFL's two unbeaten teams against each other when San Diego travels cross country to meet Marist. The Toreros bring a five-game win streak into the contest and its only loss this season came in a road test at now nationally-ranked Cal Poly. The Red Foxes have bounced back nicely from an 0-3 start, winning their last four outings and have scored more than 30 points in their last three outings. The duo has two common opponents this season: Butler and Davidson. Marist outscored those two teams, 61-31, while San Diego dominated the pair, 96-13.

San Diego Matchup to Watch: Can the Toreros rein in another PFL quarterback? Taking just PFL games into account, San Diego is the league's top defense in rushing defense (62.6 ypg), total defense (252.0 ypg) and scoring (10.4 ppg). While Marist hasn't been a rushing threat (11th, 99.2 ypg), it does provide a test with the league's top passing offense (1st, 337.8) as quarterback Mike White has made steady improvement as the season has progressed. Meanwhile, San Diego allowed a season-high 248 passing yards last week against Valparaiso, slipping to second among PFL defenses in passing yardage allowed in PFL play.

Marist Matchup to Watch: Can the Red Foxes turn over the Toreros? Marist enters Week 9 as one of the league's top defenses in terms of turnovers forced, with 14 turnovers gained in seven contests this season (10 in four PFL games). The Red Foxes are ranked second in the league with 12 interceptions this season. But despite all the turnovers forced, Marist has scored just 28 points off those miscues. San Diego is eighth in the league in turnover margin (-1) and has committed seven turnovers in PFL play alone (five interceptions).

■ Stetson at Dayton, 1 p.m.

Setting the Scene: Stetson, the PFL's road warriors in 2016, stay on the road for a second straight week when they head north to Dayton. The Hatters remained undefeated (3-0) on the road this season with an overtime victory at Campbell. Stetson has scored 30-plus points in each of its road games this season, but has only won by 20 total points in those three games. Dayton won its fourth straight game with a 15-point victory at Butler and returns to Welcome Stadium where it is unbeaten this season and has won its last 11 regular-season contests.

Stetson Matchup to Watch: Can the Hatters get into the Flyers backfield? Stetson lead the nation in tackles for loss in 2016, averaging over 10 per game. It runs into a Dayton offensive unit that has allowed just 5.13 tackles for loss per game this season. The Hatters may well need to disrupt the Dayton offense, particularly its running game which has amassed a league-best 1,179 yards and 12 touchdowns in five PFL games this season.

Dayton Matchup to Watch: Win the turnover battle. This contest will pit the league's best turnover margin squad against its worst in the category. Dayton has compiled a +9 turnover margin in PFL action, with a league-best nine interceptions to its credit. Stetson has been turnover prone in PFL action with 14 turnovers loss (seven interceptions) and a minus-7 margin in four league contests. The Flyers have scored 39 points off turnovers in league play while the Hatters, despite all their giveaways, have allowed just 21 points off turnovers.

■ Jacksonville at Davidson, 1 p.m.

Setting the Scene: Coming off the PFL's top offensive performance of 2016, Jacksonville returns to the road when it travels to Davidson. The Dolphins scored an impressive 61 points on the road last week, an outing that accounted for nearly one-third of its points scored this season. The Wildcats return to Richardson Stadium seeking their elusive first PFL win this season, though they have come closest in their two home PFL games this season (two losses by seven total points).

Jacksonville Matchup to Watch: Can the Dolphins establish the run game? Jacksonville is usually associated as one of the PFL's top passing threats, but has changed the script in 2016. The Dolphins three wins this season have each come when they have posted 40-plus rush attempts this season, punctuated by last week's 66 carries for 433 yards at Morehead State. Davidson has been tougher against the run this season, permitting just 3.9 yards per carry (6th in the PFL) and opponents are rushing just 137 yards per game against it.

Davidson Matchup to Watch: Press the home field advantage. The Wildcats have posted two of their best offensive performances at Richardson Stadium, including a season-best 405 yards in a near-win against Butler in Week 7. Freshman quarterback Stockton McGuire led that effort with 21 completions for 273 yards, but is coming off a Week 8 outing that saw him held to eight completions for 97 yards at Marist. Jacksonville has two of its three wins on the road this season but has allowed 104 points in its two games outside the state of Florida in 2016.

■ Butler at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

Setting the Scene: The Hoosier Helmet will be up for grabs when Butler makes the 150-mile trip to Valparaiso in one of three PFL series between in-state foes. Both squads enter the Week 9 matchup after losses last week – Valparaiso falling at league-leading San Diego while Butler dropped a home outing to league No. 3 Dayton. Saturday's meeting will be the 24th between the two teams as PFL members, Butler owning a narrow 12-11 edge after winning last season's meeting in Indianapolis.

Butler Matchup to Watch: Establish the run game. Butler has been a better team when the run game, led by running back Duvante Lane and quarterback Malcolm Weaver, has posted 200-plus yards, winning all three games when it hits that mark. Valparaiso has been hit-and-miss when stopping the run this season, allowing four 200-yard rushing performances this season while the other four games have seen it limit opponents to less than 100 yards rushing.

Valparaiso Matchup to Watch: Win the turnover battle. This contest is another that features a lopsided matchup in turnovers. Valparaiso is +5 in turnover margin during league play, thanks to seven interceptions in five games. The Crusaders have scored 28 points off those takeaways out of 102 points scored in PFL play this season. Meanwhile, Butler is minus-5 in turnover margin with eight interceptions thrown in league play.

■ Campbell at Drake, 2 p.m.

Setting the Scene: Campbell will look to close its odd October with a victory when it travels west to meet Drake. The Camels rallied to force overtime with two fourth-quarter touchdowns last week, but saw a field goal attempt blocked and returned for a touchdown in the extra period. The Bulldogs return to action following their off week and look to bounce back from a Week 7 home loss to league-leading San Diego.

Campbell Matchup to Watch: Rediscover the run. The league's most run-dependent team, Campbell was held to a season lows in rush attempts (28) and yardage (102) against Stetson. Instead, the Camels turned to the passing game for a season-high 51 pass attempts, 47 coming from quarterback Anthony Robbins who was called into action when starter Elijah Burress was injured in the first series. Drake is 1-4 this season when allowing an opponent to rush for more than 100 yards.

Drake Matchup to Watch: Kraemer Keeping them Honest. In the loss to San Diego, Drake quarterback Grant Kraemer was held without a passing touchdown for the first time this season and only 116 yards on 10 completions. In his previous four starts he had a throw for over 200 yards and averaged at least five yards per attempt, Drake posting a 3-1 record in that span. The Bulldogs will face a stiff test as they face a Campbell defense that is ranked just behind San Diego in pass defense, limiting opponents to 189.7 yards per game in PFL play this season.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM AROUND THE PFL

RAYMOND SETS EYES ON PFL RECEPTIONS MARK | Morehead State slot receiver Jake Raymond has focused his attention on the PFL's career receptions mark. He enters this week's action with 251 career receipts, second among FCS active career leaders. Raymond seeks to break the record of 254 career receptions set by Butler's Zach Watkins (2008-11).

HATTERS MAKE SPORTSCENTER TOP 10 | Stetson's overtime blocked field goal return for a touchdown landed the No. 3 spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays, Oct. 22. The 87-yard dash was one of the longest in NCAA FCS history, just shy of the record 90-yard blocked field goal return by Delaware against William & Mary in 2012. Senior Donald Payne blocked the field goal try, his FCS leading third blocked kick this season.

NO FLY ZONE | Dayton moved to the top of the FCS leader board in passes intercepted, notching its 13th and 14th picks against Butler in Week 8. The Flyers, who are tied with Saint Francis (Pa.), have three players - David Leisring, Christian Searles and Cameron Stubbs - ranked among the FCS Top 15 in interceptions per game.

JONES SECOND PFL 200-YARD RUSHER IN '16 | Morehead State freshman running back Trevor Jones became the PFL's second 200-yard rusher this season. His 284-yard outing against Jacksonville in Week 8 was the best rushing performance in the PFL since 2014 (Dayton's Connor Kacsor, 301 yards) and was only 29 yards shy of the PFL record set in 1996.

EAGLE'S BENNETT TACKLES 20 | Morehead State Ryan Bennett was credited with 20 tackles in the Week 8 contest against Jacksonville, becoming the first PFL defender with 20 tackles since 2015 (Drake's John Hugunin, 20 tackles).

LIVING IN THE BACKFIELD | Stetson's defense leads all FCS units with 10.6 team tackles for loss per game this season. The Hatters have posted 10 or tackles for loss in five of their seven games this season, including 16 tackles for loss against Jacksonville, Sept. 24. Stetson's Jeb Boudreaux leads all FCS tacklers with 2.4 tackles for loss per game this season.

NO GRAY AREA | Jacksonville's Henderson Gray has become the FCS' top threat on punt returns, entering Week 9 ranked No. 1 with 21.8 yards per return. He broke off a 70-yard punt return for a go-ahead touchdown at Morehead State in Week 8, his second punt return this season on the FCS' longest punt return listing.

GAHAFAER BEGINS MOVE ON PFL PASSING MARK | Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer has begun his push toward the PFL's career passing yardage mark. He now has 10,794 career passing yards and needs just 437 yards to break the record of 11,230 held by Jacksonville's Josh McGregor (2008-11). Earlier this season, he blasted past 10,000 career passing yards with a 418-yard performance against Dayton in Week 6, becoming the sixth PFL quarterback to reach the 10,000-yard milestone.

WILL KICKS WAY TO PFL RECORD | Dayton kicker William Will set the PFL record for career field goals with three conversions at Jacksonville in Week 7, breaking the record held by Drake's Billy Cundiff (49, 1998-01). Now with 53 field goals after Week 8, he has set his eyes on moving into the FCS' Top 25 for field goals made, which stands at 56 field goals made and is held by five different kickers.

DAYTON'S SCORING STREAK PASSES 450 GAMES | The nation's longest streak of games without being shutout belongs to PFL-member Dayton, which extended the streak to an impressive 451 games with its Week 7 victory against Butler. On the FBS side, Florida holds the nation's longest streak of games without being shutout at 353, dating back to the 1988 season. The Flyers streak dates back to 1976 when it suffered a 9-0 loss to Marshall.

SAN DIEGO OWNS FCS' STINGIEST DEFENSE | Entering Week 8, San Diego's defense leads the FCS in fewest points allowed in 2016, permitting just 12.9 points per game. In three of their seven games, the Toreros have permitted just one score by the opposing team. A large part of that effort is due to owning one of the FCS' best defensive units against the pass, based on its 88.52 pass efficiency defense rating (2nd in FCS).

DAYTON'S CHAMBERLIN NOTCHES 50TH PFL WIN | Dayton head coach Rick Chamberlin became only the second PFL coach to record 50 league wins, reaching the milestone in Week 6 against Morehead State. He joins former Dayton head coach and College Football Hall of Fame member Mike Kelley, who amassed a 55-16 career PFL record in 15 seasons, as the only PFL coaches to record 50 league wins.

TOREROS PROTECT THEIR OWN | Keeping true to their mascot, San Diego has not allowed opposing teams to get to their quarterback, permitting just one sack in its first seven games this season, ranking second in fewest sacks allowed among FCS teams. Only Southern Conference member The Citadel has done better, not allowing a single sack in six games.

NO BUTTERFINGERS IN THIS GROUP | Drake surrendered its first fumble lost in Week 6 action, ending a stretch of five games without a fumble lost. The Bulldogs (533 plays in 2016) coughed up the fumble to another team that has been stingy with giveaways this season... Valparaiso, which has lost just one fumble this season (543 plays).

CHRISTIAN ENDS LONG 200-YARD RECEIVER DROUGHT | Marist wideout Justin Christian's 212-yard outing against Morehead State ended a long drought between 200-yard receivers in the PFL. The drought had reached 763 days dating back to Davidson's William Morris, who amassed 208 receiving yards on Sept. 13, 2014. It is the second longest drought between 200-yard receiving efforts in the league, reaching just over halfway the 1,477-day drought from 2008-12.

MOREHEAD STATE'S HUTCHINSON NAMED FCS CHAIRMAN | Morehead State Director of Athletics Brian Hutchinson will serve as chair of the Division I Football Championship Committee in 2016-17. Hutchinson, who has served as Morehead State's director of athletics since 2004, is in his fourth year on this national committee, and becomes the first Pioneer Football League athletic director to serve as chair.

THREE PFL ALUMNI BEGIN 2016 ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS | A trio of Pioneer Football League alumni began the 2016 NFL season on active rosters. Marist alumni Terrence Fede (Miami Dolphins) and Jason Myers (Jacksonville Jaguars) and San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson (New York Giants) each continued their professional careers. In addition, Jacksonville alumnus Andy Jones was a member of the Dallas Cowboys practice squad.

Sean Horan (Butler), Nate Casey (Davidson), Taylor Coleman (Drake), Cameron Gibson (Marist) and Devyn Bryant (San Diego) were nominated for the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. In order to meet the criteria set forth by Allstate and the AFCA, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.

2015 PLAYERS OF THE YEAR RETURN | For the second consecutive season both of the league's Players of the Year return. Stetson safety Donald Payne, a two-time PFL Defensive Player of the Year, returns after finishing second among all PFL defenders in tackles per game (11.5) and tackles for loss per game (1.36). Morehead State quarterback Austin Gahafer, the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year, led the league with 291 completed passes for 3,244 yards and 24 touchdowns last season.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL | Defending champion San Diego again received the coaches' nod to win the 2015 PFL title, but the coaches also predicted an exciting race. The top three teams in the preseason poll were separated by just three points. San Diego received seven of a possible 10 first-place votes and 89 of a maximum 100 points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Dayton received three first-place votes and was ranked second with 87 points. Drake gained the remaining first-place vote and was third with 86 points.

PFL'S 24TH CAMPAIGN | The 2016 season marks the 24th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2016 NCAA FCS Championship.
